Tonight, Kevin's Fund awards the 29th annual Kevin M. Eidt Memorial Scholarship, in the amount of \$130,000, to the most outstanding senior at Norwalk High School. This merit based scholarship was created to recognize the student who most reminded the scholarship selection committee of Kevin and the qualities that made him unique. The scholarship recognizes the special individual who has demonstrated a depth of commitment and breadth of interests and accomplishments across the spectrum of academics, athletics, arts, and community and religious service.

Including tonight's scholarship, Kevin's Fund is awarding 17 scholarships totaling \$187,000 recognizing achievements in the areas in which Kevin participated and excelled. This raises the value of the 252 scholarships awarded by Kevin's Fund to almost \$3.1 million.

When our family received the first donation to Kevin's Scholarship Fund 29 years ago we had no idea the generosity and support of the communities Kevin touched would provide the catalyst for the Fund's extraordinary accomplishments. You have enabled Kevin to remain an active agent for good in every community Kevin's scholarship recipients touch.

Sometimes the paths we are on in life are unchosen ones. Navigating these unexpected paths requires others to walk with us and provide the support and direction to allow us to find our way. New Scholarship

On August 15th thanks to the efforts of Jason and Bridget Twedt Kevin's Fund was the beneficiary of the Don Carmelo's inaugural 5k run. Community Service Scholarship

Recognition by the City of Norwalk

Kevin M. Eidt Chapter of the Norwalk High School National Honor Society



2020 Recipient Spotlight

The ultimate success of Kevin's Fund lies in the recipients of Kevin's scholarships. This year we are pleased to recognize Elizabeth (Libby) Christinat 2020 Norwalk High School Scholarship recipient and 2024 graduate of Liberty University.



My name is Libby Oelhaf, I had the honor of being named the 24th recipient of the Kevin M. Eidt Memorial Scholarship during the tumultuous year of 2020. It truly is a privilege to celebrate with you all tonight, especially since my original acceptance speech was presented virtually, in my childhood bedroom, in the midst of a global pandemic. If you are having trouble recognizing my name, you most likely remember me as Libby Christinat, but I am overjoyed to share that since our last meeting, I was happily married in October to the love of my life, Carl Oelhaf! It is my joy to have him here for the first time tonight, and to show him firsthand the love and support of the Eidt family and this community gathered to honor Kevin and his legacy.

Five years ago, I was a very different person. Those of you who are familiar with my academic and extracurricular pursuits can attest to my intense drive to complete every task to perfection. For me, perception was everything. I spent the entirety of my high school career controlling the image I presented

to others, finding my value as a human in the perspective and approval of those around me. The sense of security and confidence that I was chasing, I believed, could only come about once I reached the highest point of achievement and earned the admiration of everyone. But I was wrong. The harder I worked, the more muddled my identity would become. The culmination of my undergraduate admissions process truly highlighted this reality. What was supposed to be a time of triumph after all I had accomplished came to a soul-crushing end with nine rejection letters and heaps of disappointment.

Why am I sharing all of this? Well, it was not until I stepped into the Eidt family home for my final interview in the Spring of 2020 that this tension and superficiality began to shift. Praying silently as I took my seat at the head of their dining room table, the selection committee smiling on various computer screens in front of me, I was empowered to do something I had never done before. When asked questions about myself, I was *honest*. Rather than reciting the answers I had prepared ahead of time which I believed could earn me the scholarship, I scrapped the script and told the committee who I truly was. That I loved God and my church community more than anything. That I thrived in environments and relationships that challenged me to learn. That my free time was often spent in and around water, whether at the beach or on the pool deck. That music had and always would play a vibrant role in my life. These parts of myself that I believed no one wanted to hear about were actually the very truths I needed to share all along.

Now, as a recent graduate of Liberty University, a new resident of Wilmington, North Carolina, and a newlywed, I can confidently say that my life is nothing like I had planned as a teenager. My relationship with God is still a foundational part of my daily life, my career, my marriage, and my community. Knowing Him and feeling known by Him has taught me how to have peace with myself, love others selflessly, and approach life with freedom and confidence. In discovering who I was made to be, I realized I had a deep desire to see people discover hope and healing through professional counseling. I graduated Summa Cum Laude with my Bachelor's Degree in Psychology last spring and am excited to announce that I am beginning my Masters in Clinical Mental Health Counseling in the Fall of 2025.

After my graduation this past May, I made the decision to move to Wilmington, NC for a year to be closer to family and gain experience in the workforce before pursuing further education. My love of learning and passion for youth led me to apply for a position as a substitute teacher at a

local high school. By the grace of God I was hired in September and offered a secondary position as their Assistant Varsity Swim Coach. Being able to create an environment of trust, discipline, and camaraderie between student athletes has reignited my former passion for swimming. Only a few months later, I was offered and accepted a full-time position as a Freshman English teacher at the same school. It has been a true joy to encourage students to tackle their education with confidence. Although these opportunities were far from what I had planned for this year, and have truthfully been quite challenging, working with high-school students has given me a new vision into my future as a Licensed Professional Counselor. Without the encouragement of the people in this room, and the incredible financial blessings of this scholarship, I would have been too afraid to pursue these things that truly bring me joy.

What started in the Eidt family dining room five years ago, has resulted in a woman today who is confident and full of life. I finally know who God has uniquely made me to be and am confident in His calling on my life to serve my community as a professional counselor. I want to thank everyone associated with Kevin's Fund, and all the generous donors, for allowing me to graduate debt-free and subsequently blessing my husband and I with financial freedom. I would also like to thank the Selection Committee for creating a space for me to share a large part of myself throughout the selection process, and for continuing to encourage me to pursue my passions. I, of course, have to thank my wonderful family and my husband for their constant patience, support and love. I especially would not be in the position I am today if it were not for the sacrifices of my mom and dad, Julie and Joseph Christinat, whom I could never thank enough. Lastly, I want to thank Mr. and Mrs. Eidt for entrusting me to be a part of continuing on the beautiful legacy of their son. What began as a step of faith 29 years ago has transformed into a heartbeat of the city of Norwalk. Thank you all for welcoming me into this community with open arms, guiding me with patience and grace, and for truly changing my life for the better.

The Fund's Scholarship Commitments

The Kevin M. Eidt Memorial Scholarship Fund is supporting 17 scholarships in 2025, each specifically related to achievements in the areas in which Kevin participated and excelled: ten for Norwalk High School, three for Boston College, and four available to seniors at all four high schools in Norwalk.

The Norwalk High School scholarships are:

To a graduating senior in the Kevin M. Eidt Chapter of the National Honor Society in good standing and in the top 10% of their class with a breadth of demonstrated achievements across the spectrum of academics, athletics, arts, and community and religious service. The 2025 scholarship is in the amount of \$130,000. The recipient will be announced during this evening's festivities.

The scholarship recipient is selected by a committee based on a process including a preliminary and final application and personal interview. The scholarship selection committee is chaired by Gregory D. Calnon, the 1997 Norwalk High School scholarship recipient, a graduate of Notre Dame class of 2001, and currently Managing Director - Global Portfolio Solutions at Goldman, Sachs & Co. in New York City. The other members of the selection committee are: Jay Hariton, retired teacher and former faculty advisor to the Kevin M. Eidt Chapter of the National Honor Society, Kyle Seaburg, Social Studies teacher at Norwalk High School, Despina Sidiropoulos, 2009 Norwalk High School scholarship recipient, 2013 graduate of Boston College, and currently a Leverager in Client Services at Bridgewater Associates in Westport, Ellen Story, a 1988 Norwalk High school graduate and currently VP of Human Resources at Stew Leonard's, Dr. Daniel Sullivan, Assistant Principal at Norwalk High School, and four representatives of the Eidt family. Each of the committee members has an equal vote in the scholarship selection process.

Since this scholarship is specifically designed to recognize demonstrated achievements in as many of the specific areas in which Kevin participated and excelled, financial need is not a factor in the selection process. The Fund reserves the right not to make an award in any year if the qualifications of the applicants are judged not to be consistent with the purpose and intent of this scholarship award. In the event no award is made in a given year, the amount which would have been awarded will be used to supplement the level of future scholarship awards over the following four years.

The other scholarships for Norwalk High School are:

Commencing with the 2020 – 2021 academic year Norwalk High School discontinued its class ranking system. As a result, the school established a process to identify the senior, who best represented the school across a broad spectrum of involvements and achievements, to be the Distinguished Student Speaker at the graduation ceremony.

As part of Kevin's Fund's 25th Legacy Program Norwalk High School has memorialized the Student Speaker as the Kevin M. Eidt Memorial Distinguished Student Speaker. The Distinguished Speaker will receive a \$3,000 scholarship from Kevin's Fund.

To the four-year member of the Norwalk High School Marching Band, in good standing, whose combination of commitment and dedication to the band program and academic achievement best represents the band and Norwalk High School. The recipient of this scholarship is selected by the NHS Band Director. The 2025 scholarship is in the amount of \$5,000. The recipient will be announced at the Band's year-end band banquet.

To the four-year member of the Norwalk High School Marching Band, in good standing, with the highest cumulative grade point average, like Kevin's achievement. The recipient is determined by the Principal of Norwalk High School, or a designated representative. In 2025 there are two \$2,000 scholarships, one for Norwalk High School and one for P-TECH. The recipients will be announced at the Band's year-end banquet.

To a senior in the Norwalk High School Jazz Orchestra for outstanding contribution to the Jazz program. The 2025 scholarship is in the amount of \$2,000. The recipient will be announced at the Band's yearend banquet.

To a senior in the Norwalk High School Orchestra who has made an outstanding contribution to the Orchestra program. The 2025 scholarship is in the amount of \$2,000. The recipient, selected by the Norwalk High School Orchestra Director, will be announced at Norwalk High School's annual Awards Assembly.

To a member of the Norwalk High School senior class who has made an outstanding contribution to Norwalk High School both as a scholar and an athlete. The 2025 scholarship is in the amount of \$2,000. The recipient is selected by the Eidt family based on recommendations from Norwalk High School and will be announced at Norwalk High School's annual Awards Assembly.

To further the connection between Norwalk High School and Boston College, Kevin's Fund offers a one-time \$2,000 scholarship, (amount in recognition of Kevin being in the BC Class of 2000), to each Norwalk High School senior who matriculates at Boston College. This award is incremental to all of the Fund's scholarships except the primary Norwalk High School scholarship. The recipient(s) of this scholarship will be announced at Norwalk High School's annual Awards Assembly.

One of the Boston College scholarships is awarded to a junior in the Carroll School of Management who has demonstrated the unique combination of academic achievement, character, leadership, and school spirit like Kevin's. The recipient is selected by administrators and faculty of BC's Management School. The 2025 scholarship is in the amount of \$25,000 and will be announced later this spring.

The second Boston College scholarship is the Kevin M. Eidt Memorial Boston College Emerging Leader Program Scholarship. This scholarship is awarded to the freshman in the Emerging Leader Program whose leadership skills and potential most closely reflects Boston College's philosophies of "Ever to Excel" and being "Men and Women for Others". The recipient of this \$2,000 scholarship will be announced at the organization's year end banquet on April 15th.

The third Boston College Scholarship is for Boston College EMS, an all-volunteer student-run, quick response emergency medical service organization formed in 1997 by Mark Ritchie, a classmate of Kevin's. Mark wanted to make sure future situations like Kevin's could be met with the skill and resources which could mean the difference between life and death. In 2009, as part of their inaugural year-end banquet, Boston College EMS established the Kevin M. Eidt Excellence Award

which is presented annually to the most outstanding member of the organization. In 2025 this award is being incremented with a \$15,000 scholarship towards the recipient's graduate school education. The recipient of this scholarship will be announced at the organization's year end banquet on May 3rd.
